
Description of this fund


Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term. Sam had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sam received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,109 (that is 11.09% of his initial \$10,000). Sam did not pay any other charges. This gives Sam a total return after tax of \$1,021 for the year.
